A temporary serving area is only permitted for a twelve-hour period up to six (6) times per calendar year, not inconsistent with laws governing hours of beer sales. The size of the temporary serving area shall not exceed the size of the indoor serving area of the business. One (1) uniformed certified police officer is required for a temporary serving area with a capacity of up to fifty (50) people; for larger capacity temporary serving areas, one (1) uniformed certified police officer is required for each increment of capacity of fifty (50) people. Officers shall patrol the temporary serving area as well as the interior of the permittee's business.</p> <p>Failure to adhere to the requirements of the temporary serving area special event permit may result in the temporary cessation of the event by the beer inspector or law enforcement officers pursuant to the enforcement power set forth in section 4-28 of this Code until the permittee can come into compliance with the requirements.</p> <p>Any permittee whose business does not normally admit minors during business hours may only establish a temporary serving area that likewise does not admit minors.</p> <p>Any person desiring to create a temporary serving area under this subsection shall complete and submit an application to the city business tax office on forms provided by that office not less than sixty (60) days before the first requested use of the temporary serving area.
